- I. As of 16th August, there have been a total of 576 participants recruited and 421 participants randomised.
- **2.** On 19th July, PAH/0048 became the 500th recruited participant and the 400th participant to be randomised was UHK/0042 on 10th August!
- **3.** July ended up being a record-breaking month with 72 participants recruited overall, the highest total yet. Well done everybody!
